Chamber Delivers Key Regulatory Reforms

ENVIRONMENTAL RULEMAKING REFORM [SB 652]

PURPOSE: Ensures the rulemaking process is transparent and that the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) has proper oversight.

6 of 12 members of the environmental rules review committee will represent different sectors of the business community to ensure everyone has a voice.

- The committee reviews all rules proposed by the DEQ and makes a recommendation.
- If the committee decides a rule should not move forward, they an exercise several options that could result in a rule being delayed by almost two years.

This legislation was created and drafted by members of the **Chamber's Energy & Environment Policy Committee**.


ENVIRONMENTAL PERMIT REFORM [SB 653]

PURPOSE: Provides due process to permit applicants, creates transparency for all interests, provides oversight of department decisions, and requires permitting decisions to be based on science. There are 3 appeal options for applicants before having to spend a small fortune going to circuit court:

You can request a review of the department's decision by an independent permit review panel, the **Environmental**Permit Panel.

2 You can request a hearing before an **administrative law judge** who has the power to overrule the department director.

You can appeal the **Environmental Permit Panel** for final determination
on whether the department and the
administrative law judge got it wrong.



ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE ADVISORY BOARD [SB 654]

PURPOSE: Recreates the environmental science advisory board, which was originally created by Governor Engler during his tenure. This board provides the governor with a science based second opinion on critical environmental science issues.

10 different scientific specialties will be represented in the advisory board. These individuals will be selected and appointed by the Governor.

Those specialties are:

Biology Geology
Chemistry Human Medicine
Economics Physics
Engineering Risk Assessment
Environmental Science Statistics

WATER WITHDRAWAL ASSESSMENT TOOL REFORM [HB 5638]

PURPOSE: Reforms Michigan's water withdrawal assessment tool to provide an alternative to the traditional site-specific review process. It reduces the time to get approval for a large quantity water withdrawal, which can be very **problematic for business owners and farmers**.

The law provides applicants with **new options** that allow them to hire professionals to provide the DEQ with the data they need to make a final decision.

This streamlined approach will:

- Reduce staff time for review
- Increase data flow
- Allow quicker approvals
- Increase the quality and accuracy of staff decisions.
