We are pleased to again present the Michigan Chamber's biennial voting scorecard: the 2023-24 Job Provider Index (JPI).

Every election year, the Chamber releases its JPI, tracking key legislative votes on top policy issues impacting job providers, their employees and the state's business climate and economy. We are particularly focused on fostering pragmatic problem solving and advancing policies that ensure businesses across the Great Lakes State can grow and thrive, so our communities and families can too.

While this tool is intended to inform our members, it also serves as the basis for determining the Michigan Chamber's endorsements for incumbent legislators. Any incumbent legislator who has a 75 percent or better voting record with the Chamber will receive an earned endorsement for re-election to that same office. The Chamber reserves the right to withhold an earned endorsement for any condition or information that would reflect poorly on the organization. Legislators scoring a perfect mark, or 100%, earn the special designation as a "Champion of Free Enterprise."

Only members of the Michigan House of Representatives will be up for election in 2024, not the Michigan Senate. Consequently, only the votes of Michigan's state representatives are considered within the 2023-24 version of the Chamber's JPI.

We hope this tool will serve as a valuable resource for you as both a voter and business leader as the 2024 primary and general elections approach.
